

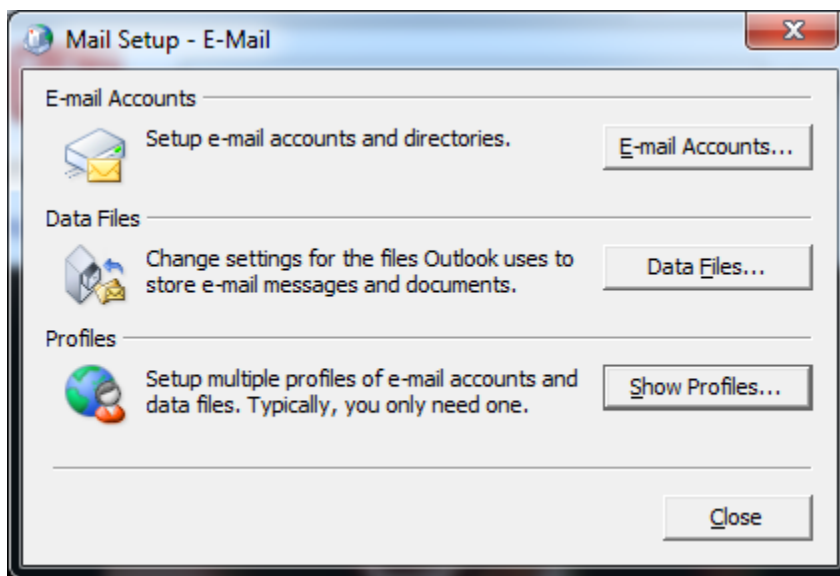

Configure your Mail account profile in Outlook 2010 by do the following:

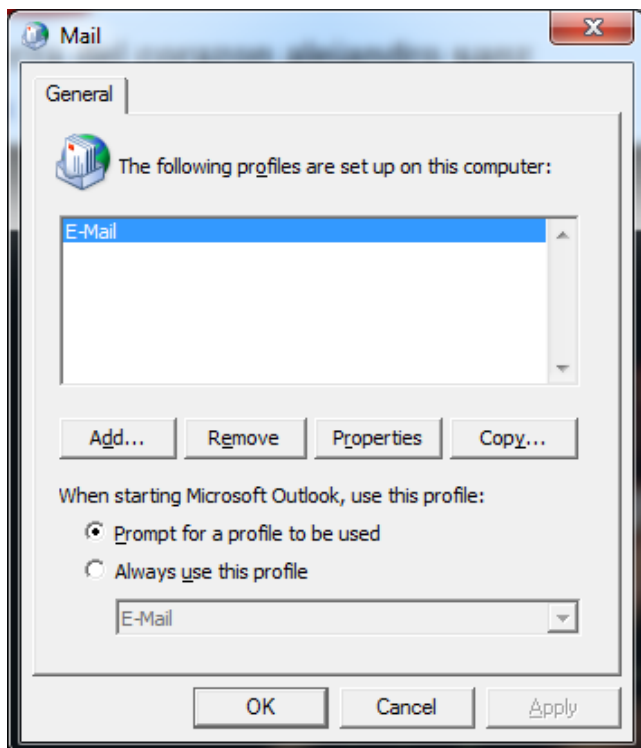
1. Go to **Control Panel**
2. Click on the **Mail** icon (if using Windows 7, click on User Accounts and Family Safety to get to the Mail icon)
3. Click on **Show Profiles**



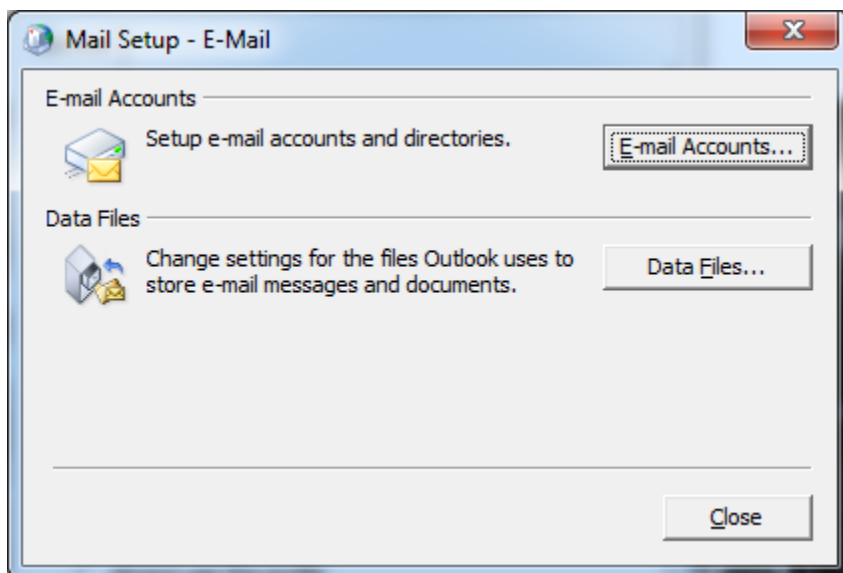

In the Outlook Anywhere section check the **Connect to Microsoft Exchange using HTTP** check box


Click on **Exchange Proxy settings** button

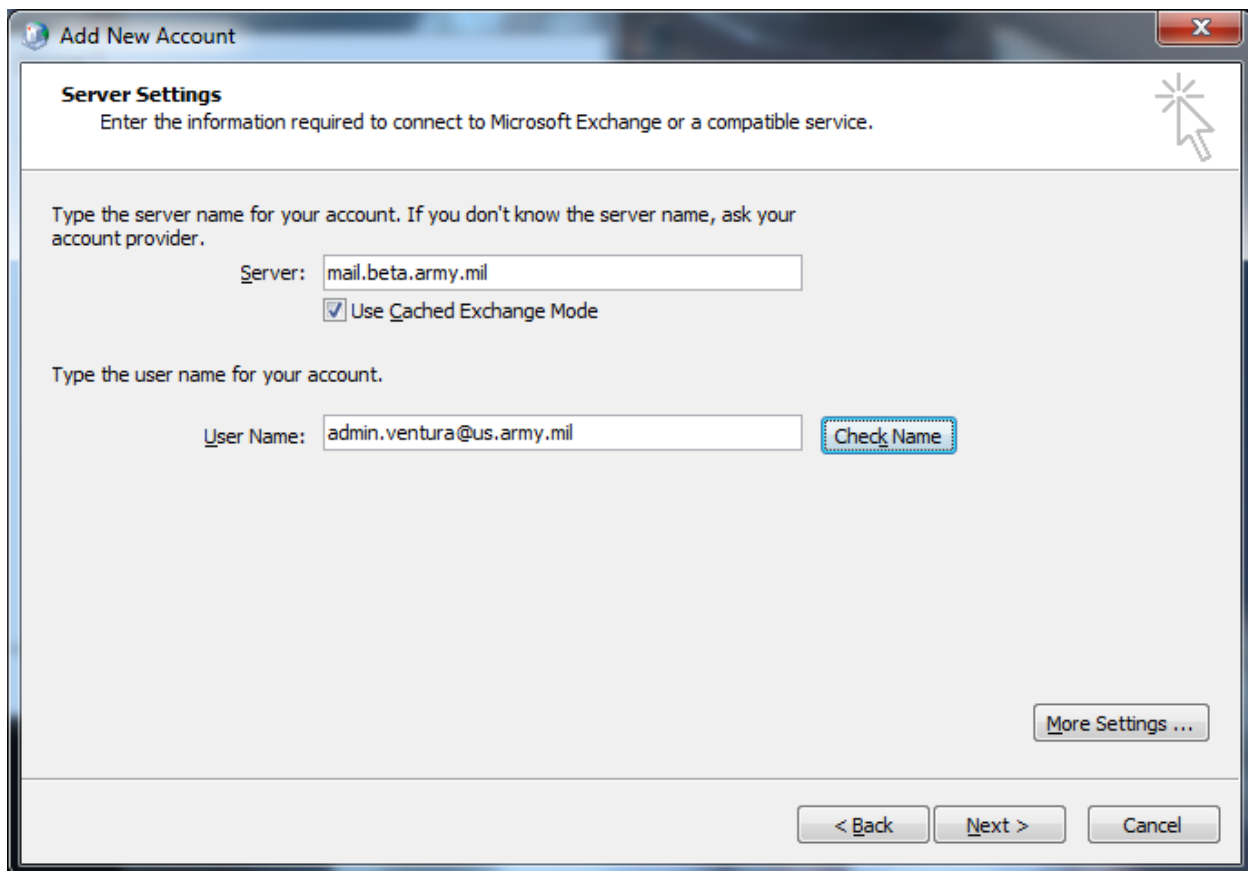

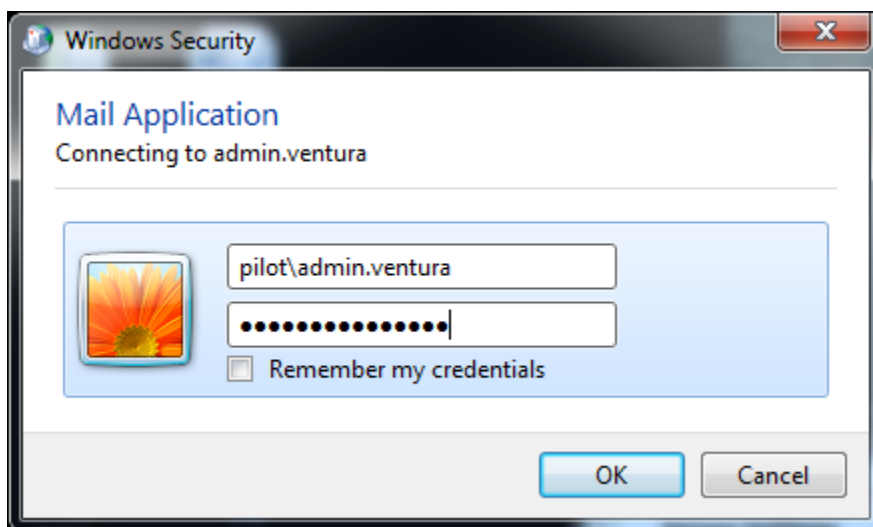

12. At the logon window enter your Beta Mail account credentials. For username enter **pilot\username** with your Beta Mail account password.


NOTE: If the @us.army.mil alias is added to the username, remove it

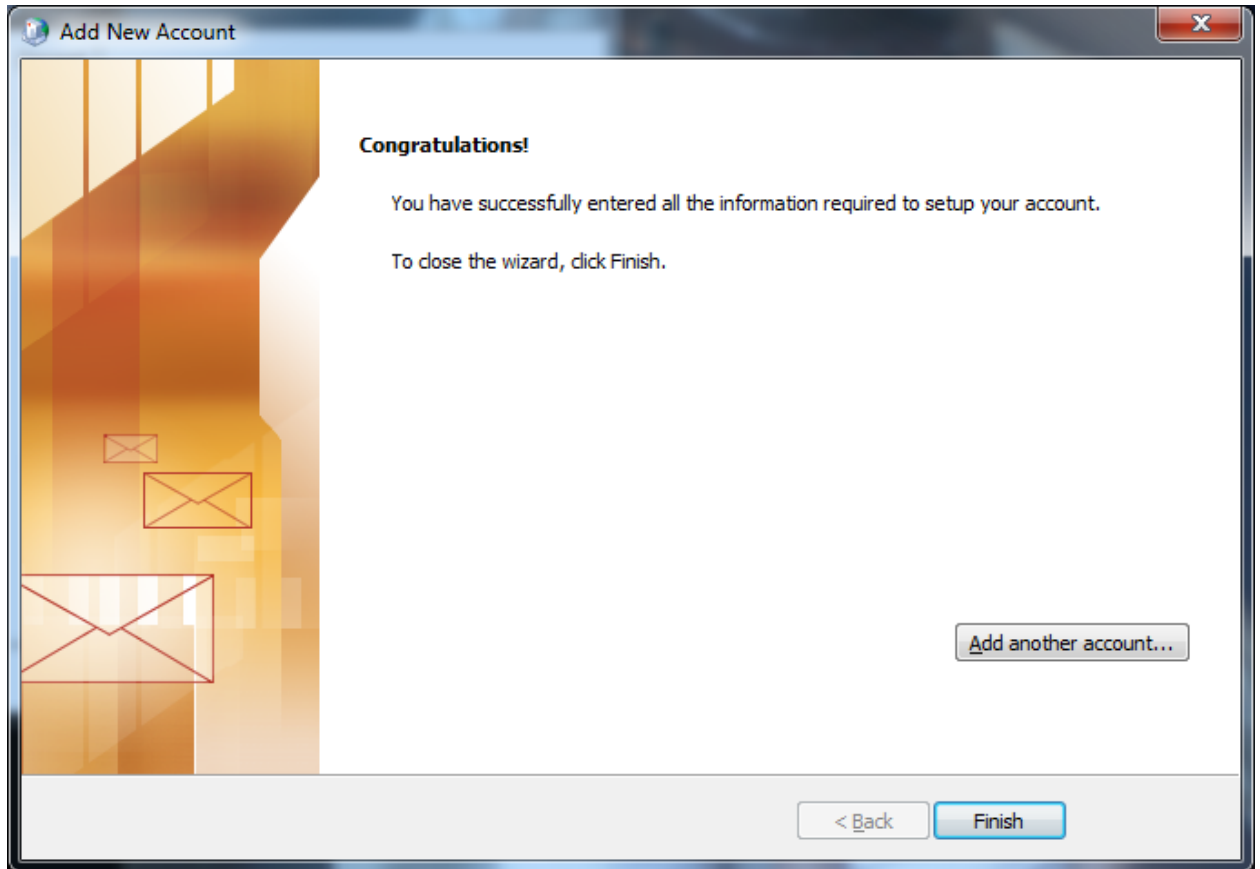
